Contents of the notes to the financial statements

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1 Basis of preparation of the half-year report

This general purpose financial report for the interim half-year ended 31 December 2010 have been prepared in accordance with the *Corporations Act 2001* and Australian Accounting Standard AASB 134 *Interim Financial Reporting*.

This interim financial report covers Russell Growth Fund ("the Fund") as an individual entity. The Fund was constituted on 17 October 2000 and will terminate on 16 October 2080 unless terminated earlier in accordance with the provisions of the Fund's Constitution.

This interim financial report does not include all the notes of the type normally included in an annual financial report. Accordingly, this report is to be read in conjunction with the annual report for the year ended 30 June 2010 and any public announcements made in respect of Russell Growth Fund during the interim reporting period.

The Responsible Entity of the Fund is Russell Investment Management Ltd ("the Responsible Entity"). The Responsible Entity's registered office is Level 29, 135 King Street, Sydney, NSW 2000. The financial report is presented in Australian dollars.

The Fund typically invests according to a mix between growth and defensive investments as set out in the Fund's offer documents and in accordance with the provisions of the Fund's Constitution.

The financial report was authorised for issue by the directors on March 2011. The directors of the Responsible Entity have the power to amend and reissue the financial report.

The accounting policies adopted are consistent with those of the previous financial year and corresponding interim reporting period.

Independent auditor's review report to the unitholders of Russell Growth Fund

Report on the Half-Year Financial Report

We have reviewed the accompanying half-year financial report of Russell Growth Fund (the "Fund"), which comprises the financial position as at 31 December 2010, the statement of comprehensive income, statement of changes in equity and statement of cash flows for the half-year ended on that date, selected explanatory notes and the directors' declaration for the Russell Growth Fund.

Directors' responsibility for the half-year financial report

The directors of Russell Investment Management Ltd (the Responsibility Entity) are responsible for the preparation of the half-year financial report that gives a true and fair view in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards (including the Australian Accounting Interpretations) and the *Corporations Act 2001* and for such control as the directors determine is necessary to enable the preparation of the half-year financial report that is free from material misstatement whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's responsibility

Our responsibility is to express a conclusion on the half-year financial report based on our review. We conducted our review in accordance with Auditing Standard on Review Engagements ASRE 2410 *Review of an Interim Financial Report Performed by the Independent Auditor of the Entity*, in order to state whether, on the basis of the procedures described, we have become aware of any matter that makes us believe that the financial report is not in accordance with the *Corporations Act 2001* including: giving a true and fair view of the consolidated entity's financial position as at 31 December 2010 and its performance for the half-year ended on that date; and complying with Accounting Standard AASB 134 *Interim Financial Reporting* and the *Corporations Regulations 2001*. As the auditor of Russell Growth Fund, ASRE 2410 requires that we comply with the ethical requirements relevant to the audit of the annual financial report.

A review of a half-year financial report consists of making enquiries, primarily of persons responsible for financial and accounting matters, and applying analytical and other review procedures. It also includes reading the other information included with the financial report to determine whether it contains any material inconsistencies with the financial report. A review is substantially less in scope than an audit conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards and consequently does not enable us to obtain assurance that we would become aware of all significant matters that might be identified in an audit. Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion.

While we considered the effectiveness of management's internal controls over financial reporting when determining the nature and extent of our procedures, our review was not designed to provide assurance on internal controls.
